

Policies for 2018 Mopar Nats Supercruise - August 11, 2018

Buckeye Lake Village officials have put several new policies in place to protect both participants and spectators during the annual Mopar Nats' 'Supercruise' on Saturday, August 11. "We welcome Mopar enthusiasts from all over the United States and Canada," Mayor Peggy A. Wells said. "We want to make sure that everyone, participants and spectators, have a safe and enjoyable evening while watching or cruising in some America's finest vintage vehicles. We invite cruisers to stop by our local restaurants and businesses."

The new policies in the Village of Buckeye Lake for this unsanctioned and unofficial event are:

- While Mopar vehicle owners are encouraged to visit Buckeye Lake throughout the weekend, cruise activities will be limited to the hours of 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday, August 11.
- Tire squealing will be strictly limited to the four-lane portion of Ohio 79 from the northern corporation limit (at I-70) to the entrance to the North Shore Park at Buckeye Lake State Park. The normal two-lane traffic in both directions will be limited to the centermost lane in each direction to provide a safety buffer between vehicles and spectators. This area will be closely monitored by law enforcement officers for both vehicle operation and spectator safety. Reckless operation will NOT be ignored in this area.
- Cruisers are welcome to continue on the two-lane portion of Ohio 79 beyond the park entrance. This portion of Ohio 79 to the village's west corporation limit is a ZERO TOLERANCE ZONE for tire squealing, burn-outs, excessive speed, reckless operation or any other applicable traffic violations. Violators WILL BE CITED! We don't want to ruin your weekend with a traffic violation nor do we want anyone injured during this nostalgic event.

"Many of our residents look forward to the "cruise" each year," Wells added. "We look forward to admiring your vehicles and hard work. But safety comes first in Buckeye Lake Village. We hope you have a great weekend at the Nats and in Licking County. We're happy you are here."
