AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OPEN BURNING WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BUCKEYE LAKE, OHIO, CREATING CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council desires to regulate open burning as here-inafter defined in this ordinance, due to the likelihood of these fires spreading and causing damages to persons and property; and

WHEREAS, many of the inhabitants of the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio, reside in dwellings which are very susceptible to fire due to their location and construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE OF BUCKEYE LAKE, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: Definitions:

(a) "Open burning" means the burning of any materials wherein air contaminates resulting from combustion are admitted directly into the air, without passing through a stack or chimney from an enclosed chamber. For purposes of this definition, an enclosed chamber is one which has only those ducts, stacks or chimneys necessary to provide combustion air and to permit the escape of exhaust gas. The burning of any materials in metal cans, barrels, containers, wire baskets or any homemade device is open burning. The bur The burning of materials in incinerators is governed by Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Regulations 3745-17-012 and 3745-17-13.
(b) "Garbage" means any matter resulting from the

handling, processing, preparation, cooking and consumption of food or food products.

(c) "Landscape waste" means any vegetable or plant matter except garbage, including trees, tree trimmings, branches, stumps, brush, weeds, leaves, grass, shrubbery, yard trimmings, and crop residues.

Section 2: No person shall cause or allow open burning within the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio, except as provided in Sections 3 through 5 hereof.

Section 3: Open burning shall be allowed for the following

purposes:

Cooking food for human consumption; and (a) Heating tar, welding, acetylene torches, highway safety flares, heating for warmth of outdoor workers, smug pots and similar occupational needs. Fires allowed by this Section shall not be used to burn garbage, landscape waste, or any other waste material and shall be of minimum size sufficient for their intended purpose. The fuel used shall be a clean fuel, that is, a fuel chosen to minimize the generation and admission of air contaminates.

Section 4: Open burning shall be allowed for the following purposes with prior notification to both the Municipal Fire Department and the District Office of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, as provided by Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Regulation 3745-19-05:
