ORDINANCE NUMBER 2005-34

AMENDING PERMANENT APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 2005-___ AND DECLARATION OF
EMERGENCY

An ORDINANCE to amend the appropriations for Current Expenses and Other Expenditures of the Village of Buckeye Lake, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2005.

WHEREAS, The Buckeye Lake Village Charter requires public reading of an ordinance to occur on three separate days with at least one week between readings, unless three-fourths of the members of the legislature affirmatively vote to dispense with such requirement.

THEREFORE,

FOLLOWING AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF AT LEAST THREE-FOURTHS (3/4) OF THE COUNCIL TO DISPENSE WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF THE BUCKEYE LAKE VILLAGE CHARTER SECTION 4.04 TO READ AN ORDINANCE ON THREE SEPARATE DAYS WITH AT LEAST ONE WEEK BETWEEN READINGS,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BUCKEYE LAKE, OHIO:

SECTION 1: That to provide for payments to the OWDA and additional expenses of the Village of Buckeye Lake during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2005, the following additional sums are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows:

Water Fund	4901	850	790	OWDA	\$ 175,000.00
Fire Dept.	2901	120	410	Operating Supplies	\$ 2,500.00


SECTION 2: That the Village Clerk-Treasurer is authorized to draw her warrants on the Village Treasury for the payment of any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore approved by the same or an Ordinance or Resolution of Council to make expenditures, provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except for persons employed by the authority of and in accordance with the laws and ordinances of the Village of Buckeye Lake and provided further that the appropriations can only be expended upon a majority vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the Village and for the purposes other than those covered by specific appropriations herein made.

SECTION 3: That in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Buckeye Lake in that monies are immediately needed to meet current expenses so that the Village may continue to progress in the pursuit of a water system this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and it shall become effective on its passage and signature of the Mayor.


