**ORDINANCE 2020-47**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL ESTIMATED REVENUE FOR  
THE VILLAGE OF BUCKEYE LAKE FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2020 AND  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to revise and/or establish additional estimated revenue for Village Expenditures, and

**WHEREAS**, this Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the daily operations of all Municipal Departments.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF  
BUCKEYE LAKE, COUNTY OF LICKING, STATE OF OHIO, AND DECLARING  
IT AN EMERGENCY THAT:**

**SECTION I.** Additional Estimated Revenue in the State Grants – Cultural Project- Pavilion Fund (2062) in the amount of \$125,000.00. New revenue is from a State Grant from the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission.

**SECTION II:** The General Fund shall advance \$125,000.00 to the State Grant - Cultural Project – Pavilion Fund to provide for the ability to secure funds from the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission. This amount will solely be an advance, and is not a transfer. The advance shall be repaid from the State Grant as funds become available, but not to exceed 12 months.




