A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE VILLAGE COUNCIL'S DISAPPROVAL OF TAYPAYERS FUNDS BE-ING SPENT FOR PRIVATE PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio desires to be on record that it does not favor the expenditure of public funds on private property so as to benefit the owner of the private property in a direct manner while only having an incidental or no benefit to the public at large.

- Section 1: The Administrative officials of the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio are hereby forbidden from maintaining, improving, resurfacing, widening, narrowing, construction, or demolishing any non public road or street within the Village Corporation limits. Non public means those roads and streets, ways, and alleys which the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio does not hold legal title to.
- It is the hope and intent of the Village Council that the aforesaid Section 2: roads, streets, ways, and alleys shall become, in the future, Village property and at that time the Village shall undertake to maintain and keep said roads free and clear from nuisance as required by Section 731.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 3: In passing this Resolution it is in the intent of Council to prohibit the expenditures of public monies either directly or indirectly on the privately owned streets within the Village of Buckeye Lake, Ohio. By way of example, Council hereby prohibits the expenditure of public money on asphalt, gravel, or other aggregates used in repairing private property. By way of further example, Council also prohibits the indirect expenditure of public funds on private property such as an employee of the Village, being paid by the Village, and working on private property.

Section 4: This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force at the earliest period allowed by law.
